
# Additions to the Public Register



## Discipline Decisions



## PUBLIC AWARENESS INITIATIVE



- Greater clarity in legislative definitions to ensure consistency
  - define "restrictions on the member's duties" (#3)
- Codify College's current practice
  - an online public register since 2001 (#36)
  - length of time and types of penalties remain on register (#38)

- Greater sharing of information:
  - College's Act should be amended to permit disclosure to outside bodies (#9)
  - Greater mutual sharing of information between College and boards (#10)
  - Member's response should be provided to the complainant (#11)
  - College should report back to both notifying and current employers (#23)

- Specific measures:
  - limited power to close hearings (#30)
  - publication bans (#31)
  - publication of all DC decisions including member's name (#33 and #34)
  - open reinstatement hearings (#39)
  - no stay in event of appeal (#46)
  - set clear legislative parameters on dispute resolution program (#13 – 16)

- Expand what information will be placed on the public register
  - reference to a Notice of Hearing once served on a member (#35)
  - undertakings not to teach (#37)
  - information about relevant criminal proceedings (#37)

#### Recommendations - Efficiency

- Faster disposition of complaints:
  - allow other ways to file a complaint (#2)
  - timeline for members to respond (#6)
  - investigations in hiatus only in exceptional circumstances (#7)
  - Registrar may appoint an investigator in an emergency situation (#12)
  - greater screening of complaints (#18)
  - steps to be taken if complaint not disposed within 120 days (#20)

#### Recommendations - Efficiency

- Timelines and speedy disposition:
  - "fast-tracking" uncontested complaints (#17)
  - timelines for Notices of Hearing (#24)
  - timely scheduling of hearings (#28)
  - full-day consecutive hearings (#41)
  - speedy release and writing of decisions (#42 referred to Discipline Committee)

#### **Current Status**

- College Council has endorsed the recommendations, some with amendments
- Bill 103, an Act to amend the OCTA was introduced but died when the House was dissolved in the Spring of 2014
- A new similar Bill is expected in the spring of 2015

## MOVING FORWARD WHERE POSSIBLE

- Changes to College practice where possible:
  - Communications strategy
  - Bylaw amendments
  - Protocol ongoing notification re: investigatins
  - Prosecutorial viability assessments
  - Increased disclosure to members
  - Principals on panels
